Professional Development Sessions

We hosted **15** professional development sessions with over 600+ Black researchers in attendance. Some sessions were open to the public with recordings only available to ABR members. Session topics included data storytelling, NIH loan repayment program, life as a doctoral student, barriers to research recruitment, building networks, introduction to clinical research, developing a framework, dissertation writing, creating compliant research programs, entrepreneurship, survey development basics, and introduction to health literacy.

National Black Researchers Week (NBRW) 2022

"Amplify, Support, and Uplift all Black Researchers"

June 20-24, 2022

With over 300 attendees and 17 panelists, the inaugural National Black Researchers Week truly connected researchers to resources. Our panelists shared lessons learned and words of wisdom with future Black Researchers in STEM, Public Health, Trauma-Informed and Educational research disciplines. They also provided strategies to support students with resume development, job searching, and interviewing. Most importantly, students were able to ask a community of Black Researchers questions about how to navigate the professional and education research journeys.


Good afternoon Ms. Leonore,
