

# COURSE SYLLABUS

## LEVEL 1 - FOUNDATIONS OF CLINICAL AYURVEDA AND HERBAL MEDICINE

This foundational level will consist of two modules, the aim of which is to provide students with a deep immersion into the foundational basics of Ayurveda and herbal medicine before progressing onto the more advanced training found in Levels 2, 3 and 4, as discussed below.

### LEVEL 1, MODULE 1 FOUNDATIONS OF AYURVEDA

Starts Thursday evenings from 4/9/25

- Session 1: Introduction to Ayurveda and the importance and relevance of Ayurveda in the 21st century public health model.
- Session 2: An introduction to the five great elements and the 20 gunas and the importance and relevance of these to Ayurvedic practice.
- Session 3: Introduction to the Doshas and sub-Doshas
- Session 4: Introduction to the Doshas and sub-Doshas continued
- Session 5: Introduction to the Prakruti – Vikruti paradigm and why this informs the foundation of clinical Ayurvedic diagnostics, assessments and treatment.
- Session 6: Prakruti and Vikruti diagnostics.

## LEVEL 1, MODULE 2

### FOUNDATIONS OF HERBAL MEDICINE

Thursday evenings

- Session 1: Introduction to herbal medicine, the history of herbal medicine and the importance and relevance of herbal medicines in the 21st century public health model. Discussions around the value, relevance and importance of herbal medicine and herbal prescribing in this diploma. Herbal monograph 1 discussion – Ashwaghandha.
- Session 2: An introduction to herbal tinctures, the pros and cons of using herbal tinctures, herbal tincture blending, prescribing and dosing for both chronic and acute diseases. Herbal monograph 2 discussion – Guduchi.
- Session 3: An introduction to herbal powders, the pros and cons of using herbal powders, herbal powder blending, prescribing and dosing for both chronic and acute diseases. Herbal monograph 3 discussion - Shatavari
- Session 4: An introduction to herbal baths, the pros and cons of using herbal baths, herbal bath blends, best practice for using herbal baths, prescribing and dosing for both chronic and acute diseases. Herbal monograph 4 discussion – Tulsi.
- Session 5: An introduction to herbal infusions, best practices for creating and blending herbal infusions, the pros and cons of using herbal infusions, herbal infusion prescribing and dosing for both chronic and acute diseases. Herbal monograph 5 discussion - Rhodiola
- Session 6: Herbal medicine safety and live Q&A session
- Pre-Recorded Bonus Sessions: An introduction to herbal medicine making with full guidance on making syrups, oils, poultices, tinctures, herbal honey, compresses and baths.

## LEVEL 2

- Building upon the foundations learnt in Level 1, Level 2 will aim to equip students with a deep immersion into the fundamentals of Ayurvedic anatomy and physiology relevant to clinical practice followed by detailed training in Ayurvedic clinical patient assessment and diagnosis.

### **Level 2, Module 1: Ayurvedic Anatomy and Physiology** **Thursday evenings**

- Session 1: The Dhatus (Ayurvedic tissue levels), their relevance to clinical practice and treatment of the dhatus
- Session 2: The Dhatus continued and the clinical importance and relevance of Ojas
- Session 3: The Srotas (Ayurvedic body channels), their relevance to clinical practice and treating the Srotas
- Session 4: The Srotas continued

### **Level 2, Module 2: Ayurvedic Diagnostics** **Thursday evenings**

- Session 1: The “Three-Fold” process of Ayurvedic diagnosis relevant to Prakruti and Vikruti diagnostics
- Session 2: Tongue diagnosis
- Session 3: Pulse diagnosis
- Session 4: Agni: Introduction, overview and diagnosis
- Session 5: Ama: Introduction, overview and diagnosis and the effective management of the Ayurvedic clinical consultation

## **LEVEL 3: AYURVEDIC TREATMENTS**

As we progress into Level 3, we shift our focus onto the exciting world of clinical Ayurveda and the foundational approaches used to optimise the physical and mental health of those we work with. To account for the inter-related nature of the content, some of this module will be delivered in an intensive 4-day online training block. Doing so will allow us to powerfully embed the core teachings whilst allowing for a higher and more in-depth level of interaction and discussion.

- Session 1: Ayurvedic nutrition
- Session 2: Ayurvedic nutrition continued
- Session 3: Ayurvedic lifestyle practices, Dinachara and circadian medicine
- Session 4: The treatment of Agni

- Session 6: Patient Intake Forms and developing the treatment protocol.

## LEVEL 4: AYURVEDIC TREATMENT PROTOCOLS

This level will provide in-depth discussions and training on specific clinical interventions and protocols for managing a huge variety of clinical ailments that are most likely to be seen and managed by complementary practitioners in their practice. These sessions will be pre-recorded and released throughout with bi-weekly tutor sessions for student.
