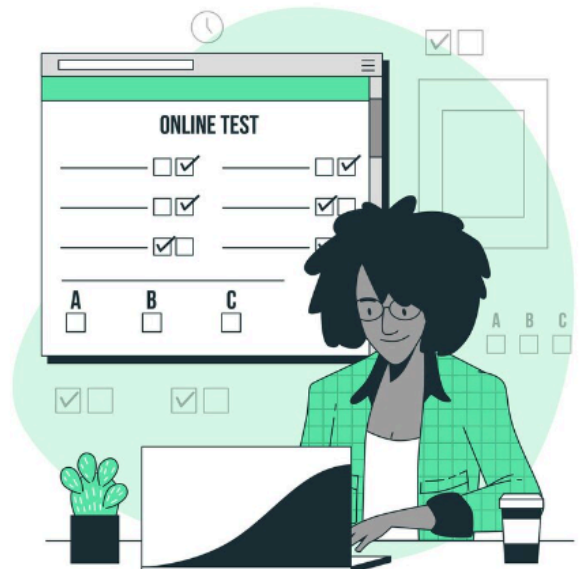

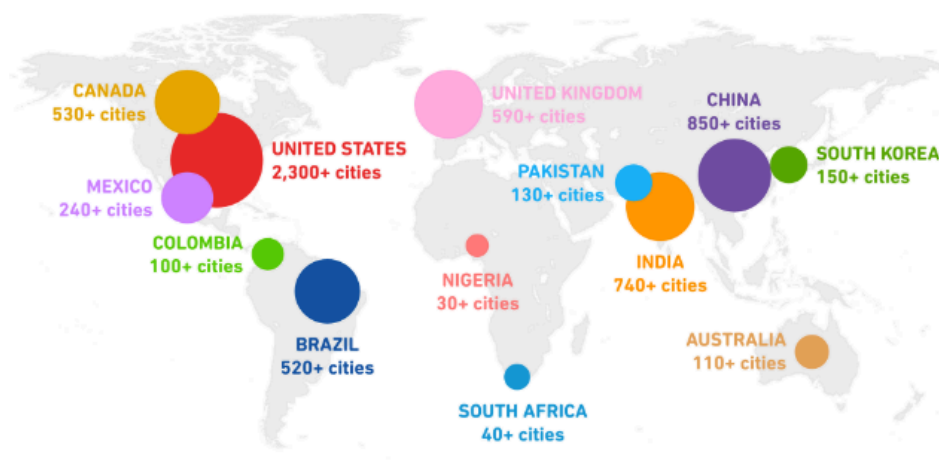


### What is the Duolingo English Test?

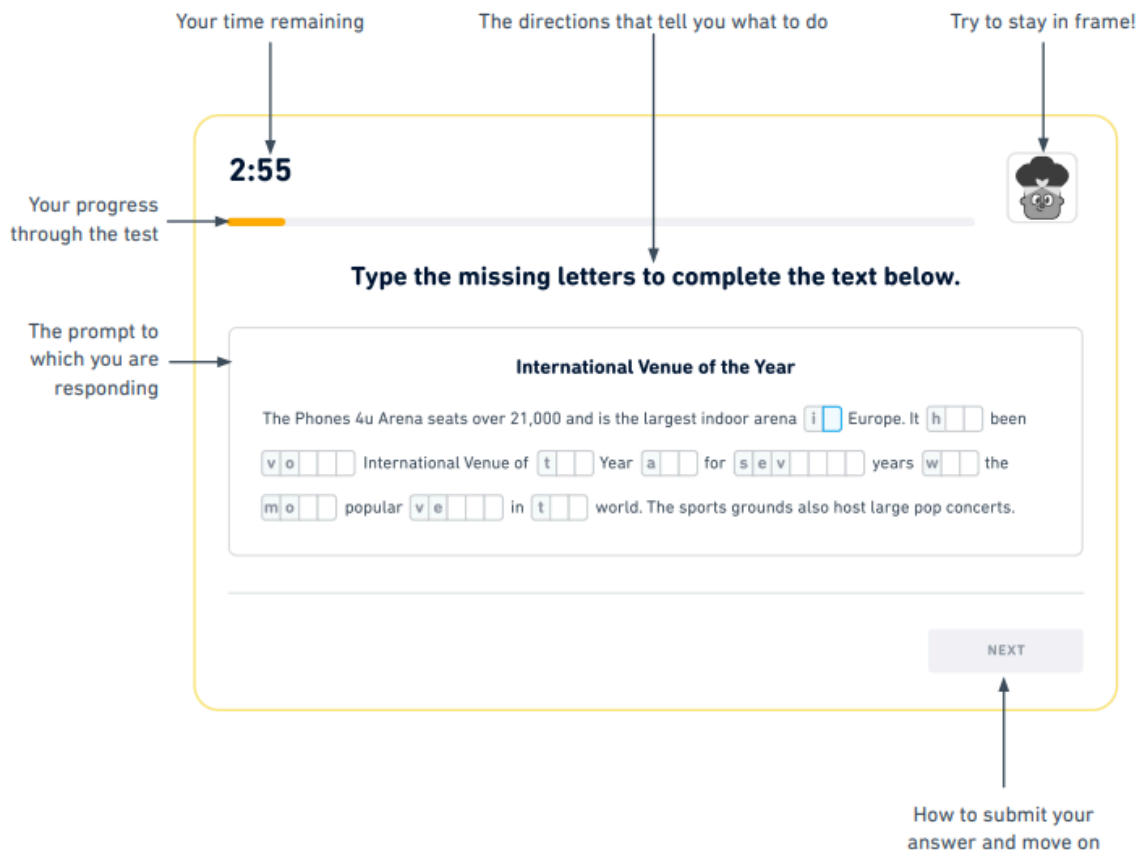

### News - June 2024

- New subscores will be added to the test!

Starting July 1st, 2024, the Duolingo English Test will include individual subscores for speaking, writing, reading, and listening, as well as integrated subscores for literacy, comprehension, conversation, and production.

The individual subscores are determined by test performance. The overall score is the average of these individual subscores, rounded to the nearest 5.

Each integrated subscore is the average of two related individual subscores. For instance, the literacy subscore, which represents the ability to read and write, is the average of the reading and writing subscores

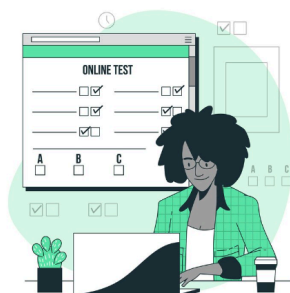
